### **Camp Scholarships Support Families**

Camp is a special place where youth can be themselves, learn more about the environment and nature surrounding them, and connect with other youth who are navigating the ups and downs of growing up. It is an important place that all youth should have the opportunity to experience, but for some, there are barriers beyond their control including the cost to attend. With support from generous donors, this past summer 736 sessions of camp were provided with scholarships. And while that number is big, what it represents is even bigger. It represents joy, for youth experiencing new adventure, for staff seeing youth thrive, and for parents knowing their kids are in a safe environment where they can learn and grow.

One mom recently shared with us the impact of camp on her family, "I was able to send my kids to Camp K because they were offered a scholarship. My son absolutely loved the experience and I cannot express enough my gratitude and appreciation for the opportunity this has given my kids to experience an amazing summer camp program in the outdoors that is safe, fun and engaging." And another mom shared



this, "My introverted middle schooler had a fantastic time at camp. She was animatedly talking about shooting a bow and arrow and how she made friends and loved that she got time in the pool. It was wonderful and refreshing to hear. Being 12 is hard for kids, but a program both she AND her little brother can enjoy really means something to this mom who has been so busy."

Sometimes we don't know the impact camp has on a youth or family until long after and sometimes we can see the impact clearly right away. Regardless, thanks to the generosity of donors, we know the impacts are far reaching beyond what we could imagine.
