We display these photos the whole week in our dining hall and they inspire a lot of great conversations and sharing.

#### 🦫 Outdoor Skills & Environmental Education

Camp activities included backpacking, fire building, shelter building, canoeing, target sports, nature hikes, tent camping, "Leave No Trace" education and more.

#### 🥎 Connection & Team Building

Many of our campers have parents that have been, or are currently deployed. They face stresses and challenges that are incredibly difficult, from the worry of where their parents are to changing schools and moving many times. Often these campers come home with new friends who know exactly what it means to be a military kid! They also bond over shared experiences and activities at camp that help them learn team building skills like the obstacle course.
